



## Qualifying Checklist

### **FREE Medical Clinic for WORKING uninsured people and their families**

FINANCIAL QUESTIONS:	YES	NO
The individual (or someone in their household) works at least 20 hours per week, on average. This means a spouse who does not have health insurance can qualify even if his/her spouse has health insurance ... as long as one of them is working at least 20 hours per week.		
The individual's family household income is at least \$13,000/year before tax.		
Family household income maximum is in the chart below		
The individual has UF Health (formerly Shands) card, VA card, Medicaid, Medicare, or other health insurance

**Definitions:**

Family = Any of the following that apply: Individual, Spouse, Children under 18, Domestic Partner living at the same address, full-time students under 23. (Other relationships may qualify.)

Income = Salary, wages, self-employment income PLUS Social Security Disability, Retirement, Alimony, Child support, Food Stamps, and Housing subsidy.

**There are some basic Health Questions that the Volunteers in Medicine qualifier will ask the potential patient in order to determine whether the patient has medical needs which cannot be adequately served at a free outpatient clinic.**

### What to bring to the appointment:

- Proof of Work income (at least one of the following):
  - 60 days of pay stubs if employed and hours are regular
  - 90 days of pay stubs if hours vary
  - 90 days of bank deposits/statements & list of business expenses if self-employed
  - Letter from your employer(s) that you do work, the average number of hours per week, and the average pay per week, preferably on letterhead
  - Proof of work related expenses if you are self-employed
- Other Income:
  - Documentation, award notification for all family members' income: Social Security Disability, Retirement income, Alimony, Child support, Food Stamps, and Housing subsidy.
- Identification
  - Government issued photo ID such as driver's license
- Personal Data:
  - List of all the members of your household and their birth dates
